

30.2 The movement may be carried out from the halt to the halt; from the halt to the move; on the move; or from the move to the halt.

In the following flowchart of the form orders are in separate sections because each section provides different details of the formation to the cadets that are about to execute the form. The parts of the order in red are **not to be said**, the cadets can infer what movement they are meant to perform with or without the red text being said.

Part one of the order identifies who you are talking to, also your section is given warning that there is about to be an order given. Part two provides details of how they will end in the formation, if the order results with them 'on the move' then you don't say anything. Part three identifies what type of for they will be performing. Part four identifies the direction they will be heading. Part five is the executive command which the cadets will execute the order. Lastly, the orders on some variants of the manoeuvre that are outlined in blue are to be said after the cadets have performed the form, these orders give additional details on how to proceed after the manoeuvre.
