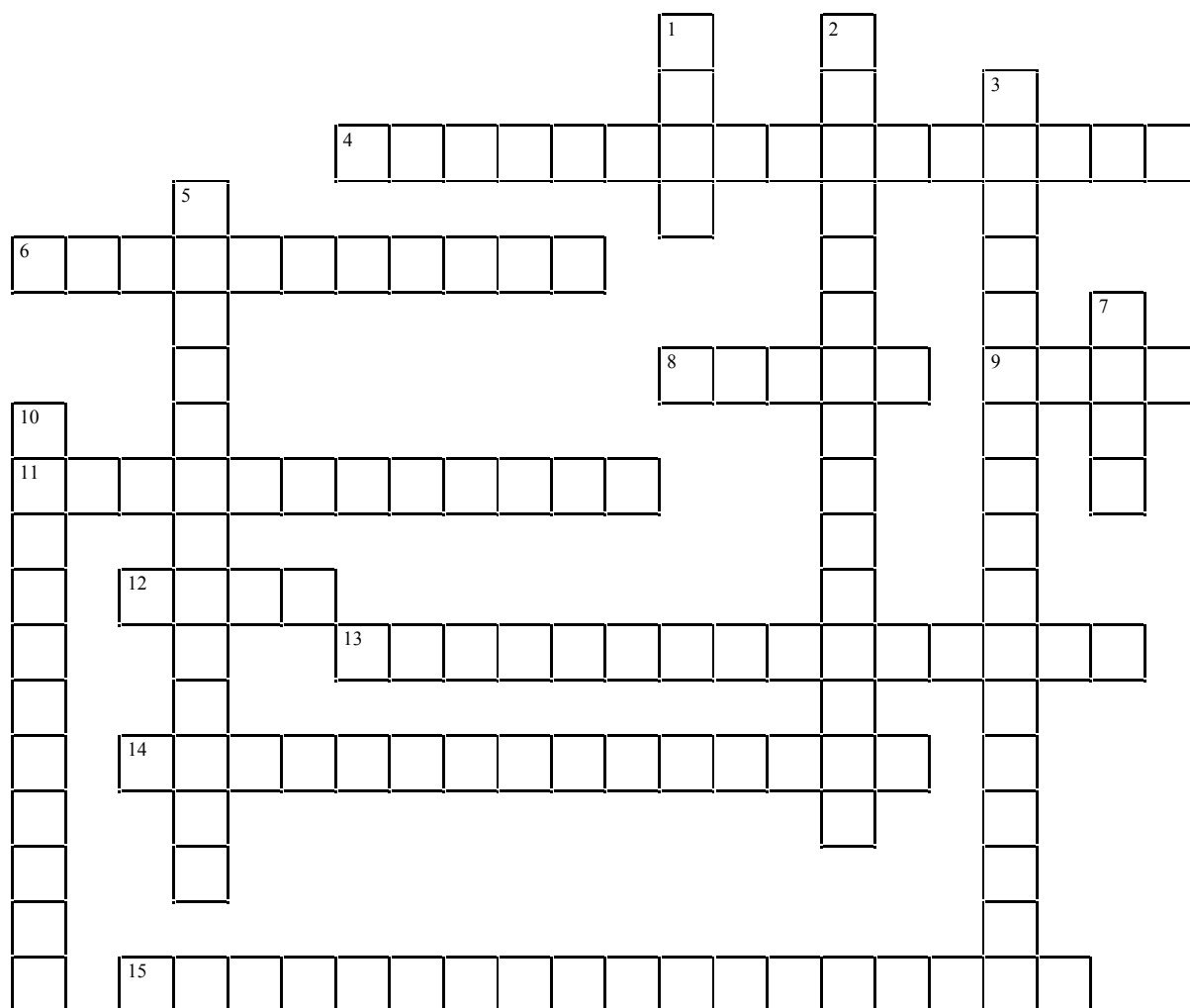

- 4 First person to cross the Atlantic Ocean in an aircraft (page 25).
- 6 First human in space (page 29).
- 8 Location of the first Squadron of the Australian Air League (page 31).
- 9 This overcomes the weight of an aircraft and allows it to fly (page 17).
- 11 This is a medical flying service that allows the pickup of patients where a normal ambulance could not arrive in time (page 5).
- 12 This is the force that resists the motion of an aircraft travelling through the air (page 18).
- 13 This involves the mustering of farm animals from the air, such as cattle and horses (page 6).
- 14 A female pilot who flew for the Far West Children's Health Scheme. Later she trained other female pilots during World War II (page 26).
- 15 This is the technique of fighting out of control fires from the air (page 7).

- 1 Abbreviation of Civil Aviation Safety Authority (page 8).
- 2 This is generally the term used for all aeronautical activities other than military and scheduled commercial airline flights in aircraft's below 5700kg (page 3).
